9. Presumptuous cf 2 Pet. 2:10:

*"But chiefly them that walk after the flesh, in the lust of uncleanness, and despise government. Presumptuous, / Bold / Daring self-willed, they are not afraid to speak evil of dignities" 2 Pet. 2:10*

- : The Words 'Presumptuous' (KJV & NKJV) 'Bold' (NRSV, NIV, ESV) and 'Daring' (NASB) Are the Translation of the Greek Word (πολμητής) English Transliteration *polmetes* the Word Is Only Used Here in The New Testament Refusing to Follow the Limits of What Is Appropriate or Permitted

10. Self-Willed / (or) Arrogant cf 2 Pet. 2:10

*"But chiefly them that walk after the flesh in the lust of uncleanness, and despise government. Presumptuous are they; self-willed / arrogant, they are not afraid to speak evil of dignities." 2 Pet. 2:10*

- : αὐθάδης English Transliteration *authades* = a Person Who Is Pleased to Listen to No One But Himself; One Who Is Self-Centered and Obstinate

11. **Despise Authority** 2 Pet. 2:10; Jude 8: The Word 'Authority' in 2 Pet. 2:10 and 'Dominion' / 'Authority' in Jude 8; Is the Translation of the Greek Word κυρίότης English Transliteration **kuriotes** cf Eph. 1:21; Col. 1:16; 2 Pet. 2:10; Jude 8
- a. Might Possibly Be Referring to the Authority of the **Apostles** cf 2 Pet. 1:16; 3:4; Jude 3 and If This Is Correct, Then by Way of Extension Today, the Authority of The **Word of God** cf 2 Tim. 3:13-4:4
  - b. Might Possibly Be Referring to the Authority of the **Lord** cf 2 Pet. 2:1
  - c. Might Possibly Be Referring to One of the Celestial **Orders** of **Angelic** Beings cf Eph. 1:21; Col. 1:16
  - d. Might Possibly Denote **All Authority** the Noun κυρίότης English Transliteration **kuriotes** Is *Anarthrous* in the Greek; It Is Not Preceded by *the Definite Article* and This Places Emphasis on the **Nature** of Authority They Despise All Forms of Authority
