#### One Absolute Truth That Is Not Universally Accepted by Most

This Rejected Truth Negatively Affects Every Human Being

This Rejected Truth Keeps People from Experiencing Supernatural Biblical Spiritual Joy *i.e.*; Delight in God

This Truth is That Every Human Being with the Single Exception of Jesus Christ Sins and Comes Short of The Glory *i.e.*; the Righteousness, the Holiness of God

"For He hath made Him, Who knew no sin, sin for us, that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him." 2 Cor. 5:21

"For we have not a high priest Who cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin."

## Apart from Holiness One Cannot be in the Personal Presence of God

"Follow peace with all and holiness, without which no man shall see God." Heb. 12:14

Being in the <u>Personal Presence</u> of God is Foundational to Attaining, Maintaining and Manifesting Supernatural Biblical Spiritual Joy.

The Scriptures Reveal That <u>Joy</u> and the <u>Presence of God</u> are Closely Connected 1 Chr. 16:27; Psalm 16:11; 21:6; Acts 2:28, 1 Pet. 4:13; Jude 24

#### There Is <u>Joy</u> in the <u>Presence</u> of the Lord

"Splendor and majesty (are) before Him, Strength, and joy (are) in His place." 1 Chr. 16:27

The Words 'Before Him' Are the Translation of the Hebrew Word (בְּנֶה) English Transliteration panel the Word Literally Means <u>Face</u> of Gen. 9:23 Gen. 32:31; 43:3; Ex. 33:11; Deut. 5:4; 34:10; 2 Sam. 14:32 2 Sam. 19:5; 2 Ki. 14:8; Psalm 69:7; Jer. 2:27; Ezk. 20:35

"Thou wilt show me the path of life. In Thy presence (is) fullness of joy; at Thy right hand (there are) pleasures for evermore." Psalm 16:11

The Word '*Presence*' Is the Translation of the Hebrew Word (בְּנֶה) English Transliteration paneh Which Literally Means *Face* 

The Word *'Fullness'* Is the Translation of the Hebrew Word (שֶׁבֶשׁ) English Transliteration *'soboah'* the Word Means to Be <u>Satiated</u>, <u>Saturated</u>, Filled to the <u>Brim</u>, to Be <u>Overflowing</u>

"For You make him most blessed forever; You make him joyful with gladness in Your presence." Psalm 21:6

There Are Two Words in the Hebrew Which Mean 'Joy' in This Verse; They Are the Words Translated 'you make him joyful' Which Are the Translation of the Hebrew Verb TIT English Transliteration chadah in the Piel Stem, Expressing Intensive Active Action, and Conveys the Thought of One Being supremely, immensely joyful

The Second Hebrew Word 'with gladness' កាក្កាយ៉ា English Transliteration simachah Translated 'with gladness' and Means 'Joy', 'Gladness', 'Mirth', 'Jubilation'

The Use of Two Hebrew Words Which Are Similar in Meaning Stresses, Emphasizes, Underscores the *Reality* and the *Intensity* of the Joy

The Word '*Presence*' Is the Translation of the Hebrew Word (קוֶבֶּ) English Transliteration paneh Which Literally Means *Face* = the Immediate *Personal Presence* of God

#### Believers Have Present and Immediate Access to God

'In Whom', Is the Translation of the Prepositional Phrase εν ἡ English Transliteration 'en ho' Which Is in the <u>Emphatic</u> Position, <u>Emphasis</u>, <u>Stress</u> Is Placed Upon the Fact That It Is 'in Christ Jesus Our Lord' – This Is Only <u>True</u> for Those Who Are '<u>In</u>' Christ Jesus Our Lord

The Word Translated **boldness** / **freedom** Is The Greek Word  $\pi\alpha\rho\rho\eta\sigma'\alpha$  = English Transliteration **parresia** "...a use of speech that conceals nothing and passes over nothing, outspokenness, frankness, plainness..." William Arndt et al., A Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament and Other Early Christian Literature (Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 2000), 781.

"...outspokenness, frankness, freedom of speech." Henry George Liddell et al., A Greek-English Lexicon (Oxford: Clarendon Press, 1996), 1344.

"In accordance with its etymology παρρησία is used especially of "freedom," "boldness" in speech. . ." James Hope Moulton and George Milligan, The Vocabulary of the Greek Testament (London: Hodder and Stoughton, 1930), 497.

The Word 'access' is the Translation of the Greek Word (προσαγωγή) English Transliteration prosagoge The Word is Used in Secular Greek for Bringing Food to the <u>Mouth</u>, Taking Medication <u>Orally</u>

The Word in This Context Expresses the Idea of <u>Access</u> into the <u>Immediate</u> <u>Personal</u> <u>Presence</u> of God

Believers Can Come into the Immediate Personal Presence of God by Means of Prayer through Jesus Christ Which Facilitates the Believer's Joy

"Hitherto have asked nothing in My name; <u>ask</u>, and ye shall receive, that your <u>JOY MAY BE</u> <u>FULL</u>." Jn. 16:24

### The <u>Scriptures</u> Bring Us into the <u>Presence</u> of the Lord

"But we all, with unveiled face beholding as in a mirror the glory of Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord." 2 Cor. 3:18

The Greek Word Translated 'beholding as in a mirror' (κατοπτρίζω) English Transliteration 'katoptrizo' Is Not Used again in the Scriptures; It Is in the Present Tense, Participle Form Denoting Producing a <u>Continual Reflection</u>

The Words 'of the glory' Are the Translation of the Greek Word (δόζα) English Transliteration 'doxa' Literally Means 'Brightness' cf Acts 22:11; the Word Is Also Used to Convey the Thought of the Essence, the Nature, Character, of a Person cf Jn. 1:14; 2:11; 11:40; Rm. 6:4 cf Eph. 1:19-20; Rm. 9:23; Heb. 1:3 Rev. 15:8; Ex. 33:18-34:9) of the Lord Refers to <u>Jesus</u>

The <u>Scriptures</u> Continually Produce a <u>Reflection</u> of the Nature, the Character, the Essence, of the Person of the Lord Jesus

# The Scriptures Which Bring Us into the Presence of the Lord Give Us the Joy of the Lord

"These things have I spoken unto you, My joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full." Jn. 15:11

The Words 'I Have Spoken' Are the Translation of the Greek Verb λαλέω English Transliteration 'Laleo' The Word Is in The Perfect Tense Form Which Places Emphasis upon the <u>Abiding Results</u> of the Action; The Words Which Jesus Spoke to His Original Apostles <u>Remain</u> Even unto Today and Are Found in the <u>Written Word</u> of God

## Theological Impact from Today's Teaching

Remaining in the <u>Presence</u> of God is Necessary to <u>Attain</u>, <u>Maintain</u> and <u>Manifest</u>
Supernatural Biblical Joy

Three Things Believers Can and Must Do to Stay in the Presence of God

- 1. <u>Maintain</u> a Mental Attitude or Mindset of <u>Prayer</u> cf Jn. 16:24; Eph. 3:12 and 1 Thess. 5:17
- 2. <u>Walk</u> in the <u>Light</u> as He is in the Light of 1 Jn. 1:5-7 = Live Life in <u>Accordance</u> with the Illuminated <u>Revelation</u> God Has Given Concerning His Essence, Nature, Character, and Will with Emphasis on What the Word of God Defines as Being a <u>Holy</u> Life
- 3. Continually Be *Reading*, *Studying* and *Contemplating* the Word of God cf Jn. 15:11; 17:13
